Hi James,

Just to clarify the works proposed on the Oak:

The tree is approximately 45ft in height. We are not proposing a percentage reduction. We will be carrying out a light maintenance prune only. We will be reducing approx 4ft – 6ft off the height, with a light lateral reduction to the sides to alleviate overhang into the bungalow garden and neighbouring gardens.

This is purely maintenance work to help retain and manage the tree long term.

A light crown lift will also be carried out to improve clearance and balance to the tree, if approved.

We are also proposing a full crown clean. I am aware deadwood removal does not technically require permission, however we would like to include this fully in the works. The crown clean will include the removal of dead, dying, damaged, diseased and rubbing limbs.

We work to BS3998 standards throughout and all cuts will be taken back to suitable secondary growth points to maintain good form and tree health.

We initially requested a crown thin in the application, however following further guidance we understand this is not considered good practice for the tree, therefore we are not proposing a thin.
